

Temporary Local Rules KG&CC – December 2020

Seams of cut turf:

If a player's ball lies in or touches a seam of cut turf or a seam interferes with the player's area of intended swing:

- (a) Ball in General Area. The player may take relief under Rule 16.1b.
- (b) Ball on Putting Green. The player may take relief under Rule 16.1d.

But interference does not exist if the seam only interferes with the player's stance.

All seams within the area of cut turf are treated as the same seam in taking relief. This means that if a player has interference from any seam after dropping the ball, the player must proceed as required under Rule 14.3c(2) even when the ball is still within one club-length of the reference point.

Dropping Zones:

Hole B3:

If a ball is in the ground under repair on the left side of the fairway of hole B3, including when it is known or virtually certain that a ball that has not been found came to rest in the ground under repair, the player must:

Take free relief under Rule 16.1 by dropping the original ball or another ball in the nearest dropping zone. The dropping zone is a relief area under Rule 14.3.

The use of a dropping zone on this hole is mandatory.

Hole B6 and C12.

If a ball is in the ground under repair on the right side of the fairway of B6, or behind the right side of the putting green of C12, including when it is known or virtually certain that a ball that has not been found came to rest in the ground under repair, the player must:

- Take free relief under Rule 16.1, or
- As an extra option, take free relief by dropping the original ball or another ball in the nearest dropping zone. The dropping zone is a relief area under Rule 14.3.
